On your own, you will select one of the journal prompts below. On a separate sheet of paper, write your response to your selected prompt.

- (1) Write about a time when you were entrusted with an enormous secret. Were you able to keep it? How did you deal with the responsibility?
- (2) Write about a time when either you or someone you know has experienced prejudice based upon your/his identity. How did you/the person you know feel?
- (3) Write about a time when you experienced pressure from the expectations that your parents set for you.
- (4) Write about a time when something someone said or did negatively impacted the way that you viewed yourself. How did this make you feel?

COVER ANALYSIS
