## **JOURNAL**

On your own, you will select one of the journal prompts below. On a separate sheet of paper, write your response to your selected prompt.

- (1) Write about a time when either you or someone you know has experienced loss. How did you/the person you know feel?
- (2) Write about a time when you had to "put yourself in someone else's shoes." How did this help you understand someone or their situation better?
- (3) Write about a place where you like to go that makes you feel safe. What about that space makes you feel this way? Describe the space in detail.
- (4) Write about a time when you experienced closure. What steps did you take to get to this point? How did you feel once you got there?

#### **COVER ANALYSIS**

As a group, you will analyze the cover of your novel. Then, you will make predictions about the text using your analysis. Write your responses on your journal piece of paper. These responses do NOT need to be in complete sentences; they can be in bullet-point or shorthand form.

- COLORS
  - O Why do you think that these colors were used?
  - o What might they represent?
- IMAGES
  - o What images are used? What might they symbolize?
  - o How are the images positioned? What might this positioning symbolize?
- CHARACTER
  - Why do you think the author chose not to put a character on the cover?
  - o What about the cover gives you possible insight to characters in the book?
- TITLE
  - What role do you think "mockingbird" plays in the book?
  - o Why is a "mockingbird" phonetically written out the way it is?
  - o How do you think the term "mockingbird" will be important in the novel?
