
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BUILDING BACKGROUND: VOCABULARY NOTES [PART A]

Directions: You will complete the vocabulary chart below for your assigned word.

- (1) WORD: Write your vocabulary word in the center circle.
- (2) DEFINITION: Write the definition of your vocabulary word. Make sure to have a thorough definition.
- (3) EXAMPLES: Write examples of your vocabulary word. Examples may be historical or modern. You must have a minimum of 3 examples.
- (4) CAUSES: Write what you think causes your vocabulary word to be created and/or occur. (Tip: Refer back to your examples and think of what causes them.) You must have a minimum of 3 causes.
- (5) POSITIVE & NEGATIVE EFFECTS: Write the effects of your vocabulary word. Consider that the effects can be on the producer/doer of the word, on the recipient of the word, and/or on the entire society as a whole. You must have a minimum of 2 positive and 2 negative effects.
- (6) GRAFFITI WALL: You will research and write a quote, symbol, art piece, etc. that incorporates your word and meaning into the graffiti wall.
